



The American College of Surgeons (ACS) Division of Education, partnering with the University of Wisconsin (UW) Department of Surgery, is seeking applicants for the UW-ACS Surgical Education Research Fellowship. This program offers a two-year fellowship in surgical education research for surgery residents, beginning July 1, 2016. The goal of the fellowship is to provide the knowledge, skills, and hands-on experience required to become nationally recognized leaders in the field of surgical education. Fellows have the option of participating in the UW School of Education master's degree program while also engaging in surgical education research through the ACS and UW.

The application has a rolling deadline until the position is filled. Applicants must provide a personal statement (maximum one page) outlining program interest, curriculum vitae, and supporting letters from the head of the department of surgery and the program director. Interested applicants must be in good standing in an accredited residency program. Fellowship acceptance requires a commitment from the applicant's institution that the resident must be able to return to their prior position held in the residency program after completion of the fellowship.
