# University of Wisconsin Surgical Education Research Fellowship

The University of Wisconsin Department of Surgery, in collaboration with the American College of Surgeons (ACS), has established a research fellowship in surgical education research. This program is designed to provide fellows with the opportunity to obtain the specialized knowledge, skills, and training required to become leaders in the field of Surgical Education.

## The program focuses on a wide variety of areas of emphasis:

- Performance measurement
- Simulation
- Continued medical education
- Adult learning
- Curriculum development
- Resident education

## Fellows who participate in this program will:

- Have the option to complete coursework for a master's degree through the UW School of Education while engaging in surgical education research
- Benefit from the variety of research opportunities offered through the UW Department of Surgery and ACS
- Have the freedom to tailor their research goals based on their interests
- Gain exposure to education research mentorship from the UW Department of Surgery and ACS

## Coursework, seminars, and conferences will provide fellows with knowledge and skill in:

- Study design
- Communication of research findings and scientific writing
- Ethics/responsible conduct of research
- Research knowledge specific to primary field of study
- Career development/leadership
- Broad research knowledge in surgical education

Applicants must have completed at least two years of general surgery residency and must be willing to commit to two years to complete their research fellowship before returning to their clinical residency program. Fellows will receive financial support for tuition costs and a stipend.
