Dr. Debra DaRosa

Dr. Debra DaRosa is Professor Emerita of Surgery and Medical Education in the Department of Surgery at the Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine (NUFSOM), where she served as the Vice Chair of Education for 16 years. She began her academic career in surgical education in 1980 and has dedicated the majority of that time to developing and delivering faculty development programs, conducting educational research studies and consulting

with clinical departments, hospitals, and professional societies. She has published over 150 abstracts, papers and book chapters, and has presented her research, keynote addresses, and faculty development programs at regional, national and international forums.

Dr. DaRosa serves as the Program Director of the Association of Professors of Obstetrics and Gynecologys' (APGO) Academic Scholars and Leaders Program. She assisted on the design, development and delivery of the American College of Surgeons' (ACS) Surgeons as Leaders course, the ACS's Surgeons as Educators program, as well as their Resident as Teacher and Leader course. Dr. DaRosa served as the Course Director for the ACS's Surgeons as Educators course from 1993 to 2018. She also founded the ASE's Surgical Education Research Fellowship (SERF) program. These national programs are still ongoing.

Dr. DaRosa was the first non-clinician elected President of the Association for Surgical Education from 1991-1992. This same organization honored Dr. DaRosa with the Distinguished Educator Award in 2001. Dr. DaRosa served on the editorial boards of the AAMC's journal, Academic Medicine and the Journal of Graduate Medical Education. She is an honorary member of the Association of Women Surgeons and is one of two non-surgeons awarded an honorary membership to the Association of Professors of Gynecology and Obstetrics. Dr. DaRosa is the grandmother to five grandchildren, mother of two adult children, and the wife of one husband. She enjoys the three R's including reading, riding, and rock and roll.
