"I was delighted to be awarded the CESERT Gold Grant in 2021 for our research investigating virtual assessment



of laparoscopic skills. This study is a randomized controlled trial asking participants to rate FLS peg transfer videos over a survey format, which means that, without a hefty incentive, participation would likely be close to zero. Therefore, this grant has made our research possible; this "small" grant of \$500 turned our research question into reality! 


